Online Qualifier

What is the Online Qualifier?

The Online Qualifier is a K-12 InVenture Prize event that takes place online. It is designed to give students feedback on their project before they compete at the state level K-12 InVenture Competition in March.

Teachers upload their students' project proposals to our online RocketJudge platform. Georgia Tech students, K-12 InVenture teachers, and industry experts will evaluate each teams' projects and provide constructive feedback about the design and concept.

Students will be able to adjust their final project before presenting at the State Finals.

Only the top teams will be chosen to compete in the State Competition at Georgia Tech in March due to limited space.

What do you need to submit?

K-12 InVenture Prize teachers will need:

1. A Project Title
2. A short abstract of the project (Max 1000 characters including spaces)
3. A 3 - 4 minute video of the kids presenting their project
4. One PDF of pictures, powerpoint slides, etc. Must be less than 10MB

The projects and prototypes do NOT need to be complete!

PLEASE be sure to mark the video as public, or else the judges will not be able to view the video from your link.

How do you get the feedback?

Feedback will be emailed to teachers via RocketJudge by February 28th!

How to upload videos on YouTube?

1. Sign in to YouTube. (youtube.com)

2. At the top right, select "Create a video or post" and then Upload video.



3. Select the file you'd like to upload.

a. If you're not sure which format to save your video as or are getting an "invalid file format" error message when you're uploading, make sure that you're using one of the following formats:

i. .MOV, .MPEG4, .MP4, .AVI, .WMV, .MPEGPS, .FLV, 3GPP, etc.

4. Name the file & mark, "Yes, it's made for kids."

5. After you put in the video details, the 3rd step: "Visibility" has a drop down option to make the video **public**
